OUR MISSION

Olathe Health Physicians (OHP) is focused on helping people through healing, health and happiness. OHP's 36 freestanding clinics make quality healthcare convenient with walk-in responsiveness and many on-premise health services.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT REPORTING

Community benefit is defined as programs and activities that promote health, healing and wellness that directly address community need. Community benefit is organized into several categories. They are benefits for persons living in poverty, including charity care, unpaid costs of public programs such as Medicaid, and community health improvement services. Other activities fall into the community building category. These benefits include programs that improve community health, education, subsidized health services, financial and material donations and other similar activities.

For the purpose of this summary report, we have highlighted some of the key categories of support provided by OHP in 2021.



Charity Care and Means-Tested Government Programs \$5,842,885

The unpaid cost of medical services provided to uninsured and underinsured. This amount has risen steadily over the years, and especially over the past five years. Uncompensated care includes the cost of providing care to patients who meet the guidelines of the OHP's charity care program, and the cost of providing care in excess of reimbursement to participants in the Medicaid program and other indigent public programs, such as free clinics.



General Community Support \$2,462

As part of its mission to serve the needs of the community, OHP provides a wide variety of uncompensated services to the community at large. Examples include staffing first aid booths at public events, providing free flu shot clinics, and distributing health information to participants at public health fairs.
